## **EXPERIENCE**

- 7500 hours over past 10 years
  - 900 hours in 4 of 6 BABOK® Knowledge Areas
- Hours spent on business activities (not just working hours)
- Online application requires project information
  - Project name
  - Start/end date (estimate if needed)
  - Role
  - Organization and contact
    - · Let them know ahead of time
    - Contact does not need to still be employed there
    - If all else fails default to HR
    - Share your approach and application with them as appropriate
  - Hours spent doing business analysis tasks
  - Describe tasks and deliverables
- The IIBA® audits some applications, so be prepared to support the hours
- Report BA hours only
  - The IIBA® will deduct a proportionate percentage of hours for non-BA tasks from reported hours

## PROFESSIONAL DEVELOPMENT

- 21 hours in past 4 years
- You must have the 21 hours of courses **before** you submit your application.
- Business analysis training topics
  - Requirements elicitation
  - Requirements analysis or modeling courses,
  - Requirements planning/managing
  - etc.
- Training on related fields such as project management or software testing do not count towards the 21 hours.
- You do not need to submit a course certificate with your application, but be prepared to provide one if you are audited.
- Watermark Learning CBAP Certification Preparation v2.0
  - In person
  - Virtual
  - On demand

## REFERENCES

- Need 2 from any of these
  - Career manager (<u>not</u> project manager)
  - Client
  - CBAP
- Contact them in advance
- Once entered on application, an email will be sent with link to complete the reference
- Do this early as references must be complete before application will be accepted

## **APPLICATION**

- CBAP Application Worksheet (Excel)
  - The tasks provided in the spreadsheet are considered BA tasks by IIBA
  - Remember only select BA tasks when submitting your application!
- My approach
  - Experience
  - Application
    - Spell check!
- Timelines
  - Within two weeks of receiving your application package, IIBA® will notify you that your application is being processed.
  - The IIBA® will then assess the application for completeness and fulfillment of the CBAP or CCBA certification requirements.
  - The IIBA® will notify you, via email, of the results of this assessment within 21 days of receiving the application.
    - Mine took 8 days (expect longer timeline now)

## **EXAMS**

- 150 multiple-choice questions
- CBAP
  - Many situation-based questions that require candidates to apply their knowledge of the BABOK®
  - Based mostly on the tasks and techniques identified in the BABOK®, version 2.0
  - The BABOK® references other sources that CBAP candidates may find helpful
- CCBA
  - Mostly comprised of knowledge and fact-oriented questions about tasks and techniques in the BABOK®
  - Based solely on the BABOK®, with knowledge-based questions only
- The IIBA® has not published percentages, but assume you will need to score 70% or better to pass
- Best guess is that the first time pass rate is between 80% and 90%
  - The IIBA® screens applications so well and demands so many years of experience
  - Examinees so far have been super-prepared to pass

## **EXAM PREPARATION**

- Read the BABOK
- Study by Style
- My approach
  - Amazon Fire reader
  - Study Guides
  - Practice Exams
    - Online and paper
  - Mnemonics
  - Flash Cards
    - Audio
- Median study time 100 hours (80 hours after taking a CBAP preparation class)
- Ideal time to take the exam is 6-8 weeks after taking a prep class

## **EXAM DAY**

- Rest, food, hydration
- Resist temptation for final cram
  - Relax
- Test center
  - Exact match on ID name
    - Middle name and suffix
  - Lockers
  - TSA style wand
  - Sign in/sign out
  - Big brother watching
- Brain dump
  - I wrote the mnemonics and filled them out as needed (just a few)
- Online administration
  - Flag questions for review
  - Plan breaks
    - Can't leave building but unattended
- My approach
  - 75 Questions then 5 minute break (twice)
  - Flagged Questions
    - Flagged ~ 1/2
    - Changed very few after review
  - About I hour for each part (3 hours + breaks)

## WHY NOW?

- Cut over to BABOK v3 expected in September
- v2 well established and understood
- $\sim \frac{1}{2}$  the material to cover
  - BABOK v2  $\rightarrow$  271 pages
  - BABOK v3  $\rightarrow$  514 pages
- Terminology changes
  - Appendix D: Summary of Changes from BABOK® Guide v 2.0
